Age Friendly Saco Mobility Shuttle

Are you a Saco resident aged 60 years or older, still independent, but no longer drive? The Age Friendly Saco Mobility Shuttle can help!

The Shuttle provides door -to-door transportation to area businesses in the Saco/Biddeford area. We have regularly scheduled stops to Walmart, Market Basket, Target, Hannaford, and Shaw's. We can also schedule a ride to other area businesses.

Outside of our regular scheduled days, if Age Friendly is affiliated with the net happening in the Saco area, we will provide rides to that event. We offer rides to our Community Luncheons that order once a month at the Elks Club - just let the office know when registering for the luncheon that you need a ride. In addition, when we have partnered with Saco Parks and Rec for events such as the Sock Hop and Hoedown, we offered rides to those events as well.

Any questions? Give our Shuttle Scheduling Coordinator a call to see if we can assist you with transportation to help you with your daily living needs. Enhance Your Independence: Free Echo Dots & Smart Plugs for Saco's Older Residents!

Age Friendly Saco, in collaboration with the University of Maine Center on Aging and with funding provided by UNE's Geriatrics Workforce Enhancement Program, is pleased to offer a limited number of Echo Dots and smart plugs to older residents of the City of Saco.

Did you know that a simple Echo Dot can function as a virtual personal-assistant in your home? Echo Dots are voice-activated devices that allow you to control various smart devices using voice commands. With just your voice, you can turn on lights, make phone calls, set timers, play music, and more. The device can also provide reminders for taking medications and assist with daily tasks.

Pairing an Echo Dot with a smart plug gives you even more control over plugged-in devices. For example, if you plug a lamp into a smart plug and then connect it to a wall outlet, you can use voice commands to turn the lamp on or off. You can even program the Echo Dot to turn the light on automatically when your alarm goes off.

How to Avoid Being Scammed

Individuals are increasingly targeted by sophisticated scams designed to exploit their trust and financial stability. Understanding these fraudulent schemes and implementing protective measures are crucial for safeguarding oneself and loved ones. **Prevalent Scams:**

Internet Romance: Fraudsters create fake profiles on dating websites or social media, cultivating a seemingly genuine romantic connection. They gain the trust of seniors over time and then exploit the emotional bond to request money, gifts, or sensitive personal information under the guise

Sweepstakes and Lottery: Victims are informed they've won a prize or lottery but must pay fees or taxes upfront to claim it. After payment, the promised winnings never materialize.

of personal emergencies or travel

difficulties.

Robocalls and Phone: Automated calls offer fraudulent services or products, such as extended warranties or investment opportunities. Some may claim a loved one is in trouble, urging immediate financial assistance.

Computer Tech Support: Scammers pretend to be tech support, warning of viruses or issues on one's computer. They request remote access or payment for unnecessary services.

AI Voice Cloning: Advanced technology enables scammers to mimic voices of relatives or friends, making urgent requests for money due to fabricated emergencies.

Government Impersonation: Scammers pose as officials from agencies like the IRS, Social Security Administration, or Medicare, claiming unpaid taxes or issues with benefits. They often threaten arrest or benefit suspension to elicit personal informationor immediate payments.

Protective Measures:

Verify Identities: Always confirm the identity of individuals or organizations contacting you. Use official channels to reach out directly and validate claims.

Safeguard Personal Information:

Never share sensitive details like Social Security numbers, bank accounts, or passwords over unsolicited calls, emails, or messages.

Be Skeptical of Unsolicited Offers:

Approach unexpected communications with caution, especially those requesting immediate action or payment.

Use Secure Payment Methods:

Avoid unconventional payment methods such as gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency for transactions.

Monitor Financial Accounts: Regularly review bank and credit card statements for unauthorized transactions and report any suspicious activity promptly.

Stay Informed: Keep abreast of common scams and educate yourself and loved ones about potential threats.

By remaining vigilant and adopting these protective strategies, you can significantly reduce the risk of falling victim to scams and maintain your financial security.

This crucial step allows them to claim the Property Tax Fairness Credit and benefit from the Saco Senior Tax Assistance Program- programs that can provide significant financial relief for those on fixed incomes.

Many eligible seniors miss out simply because they've never filed before and need guidance. Your help in E-filing this form could make all the difference!

If you're willing to volunteer, please call our office and leave your name and phone number. We'll match you with a resident in need, and all arrangements will be coordinated directly between you and them.

Deadline: The 1040ME must be filed by **April 1, 2025**.

Property Tax Savings ∨ Filing Deadline Reminder

If you are applying for the Saco senior tax assistanceprogram, the 1040ME form must be filed no later than **April 1, 2025**. If you have not filed yet, time is running out, and we urge you to get the 1040ME form submitted on time and not miss out on this big savings.

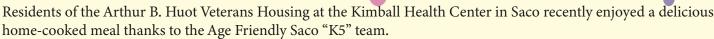
If you do not qualify for the Saco assistance program and are applying only for the property tax fairness credit, the deadline is **April 15, 2025.**

Additional reminder: You must apply every year for both programs.

Marcia's Chicken Corn Chowder Recipe A "K5" Favorite!

Looking for a warm and comforting meal? Try Marcia's Chicken Corn Chowder, a highly requested recipe from "K5"!

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. cooked chicken, cut into chunks
- 2 cans kernel corn
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 12 oz. potatoes, chopped
- 3 minced garlic cloves
- 1 medium diced onion
- 3 diced carrots
- 2 stalks diced celery
- ½ tsp. thyme and oregano
- Dash of cayenne pepper, salt, and pepper to taste
- ½ cup half & half
- 2 tbsp. cornstarch
- 2 tbsp. butter

Instructions:

Place all ingredients (except cornstarch and half & half) in a crockpot and cook for 3 hours on high or 7 hours on low. In the last 30 minutes of cooking, whisk together half & half with cornstarch and butter, then stir into the crockpot.

Optional: Marcia caramelized the onions and parboiled the carrots and potatoes beforehand for extra flavor. Enjoy this warm, hearty dish!
